Confirmation Spiritual Reflection 2021

Choose a spiritual reflection from this list. Candidate and sponsor should meditate on the same reflection (*you can read/meditate on it separately but should reflect/discuss it together at the same time*). If you already subscribe to a different Catholic* blog/podcast/devotional app, etc., you are welcome to use that as your spiritual reflections source instead.

Prepare your mind and body for the reflection by finding a comfortable place to sit and take a few deep, "cleansing" breaths...

Meditate... Read (and if necessary, re-read) the reflection. Pay attention to unusual words or phrasing (it is likely they were chosen for a specific reason)... Think deeply about what the author is saying; search for the nuanced meaning and wisdom of the text.

Discuss with your sponsor (or parent). Keeping in mind that the purpose of the spiritual reflection exercises is to help you grow in your awareness of - and connection to - God, use the questions below to help you draw out the deeper/personal meaning of this reflection.

- What is the deeper meaning/wisdom that I found in this reflection?
- What insight does this reflection give me about God?
- What insight does this reflection give me about my relationship with God?
- What is God saying to me or asking of me today?

Share. The ability to articulate our belief is an essential part of the spiritual growth that we are all called to experience over a lifetime. Like Paul in his letter to the Christians in Rome; we, the community of St. Joseph the Worker, are praying for you (Candidates, Sponsors, and families) during this journey of faith. I ask that you also encourage us! **With your sponsor** (or parent), prepare a short synopsis of your shared reflection on these questions with me (<u>bshay@sjtw.net</u>... 2-3 sentences each will suffice). Let us "encourage one another and build one another up in the Lord" (1 Thessalonians 5:11)

We are asking you share only one reflection with us, but invite – and indeed, encourage all candidates, sponsors and/or parents to make spiritual reflection a regular part of your spiritual diet. Bon Appétit!
